The Enemy of the Good

"The perfect is the enemy of the good." I heard this phrase used by a politician. Apparently, it is a relatively common expression but I don't remember hearing it before last week. When I heard it, I thought "huh, it sounds right." Like many expressions and clichés, it is probably a statement that oversimplifies the truth. Nevertheless, it rings true. The statement is a quote from Voltaire, an 18th century French philosopher and writer. Voltaire was an outspoken believer in freedom of religion, freedom of speech, and the separation of church and state. He was also a sharp critic of Christianity, especially the Roman Catholic Church. He was known for his wit and is often quoted by revolutionaries.

I think I like the expression. It certainly resonates with the way I feel about the last Special Session of General Conference of the United Methodist Church. The special session was supposed to consider the proposals of a "Commission on A Way Forward" for our denomination that has been divided over LGBT issues within our church. In my opinion, it turned out to be a colossal waste of time and money. When the Conference ended, we changed nothing except strengthen the resolve of those of us who believe our present statements about human sexuality is wrong. I do not want to belong to a church that excludes people because of who they love. Yet, I am not ready to leave the United Methodist Church because of the decision made in St. Louis last month.

If you're not up to speed, let me give you a quick explanation. The Special Session was called in 2016 with the hope that we could move beyond the continuing arguments over sexual orientation. There were three plans; The Traditional, The One Church, and The Connection of Conference. The Connectional Conference plan was to remove all language from our Discipline that excludes LGBT from ordination or celebrating same-sex weddings. The One Church Plan was designed to allow local churches, pastors, and conferences to act according to their conscience and their theological understanding of

these issues. The Traditional Plan, which was the only plan for which there was a general vote, would leave things the same. The Traditional Plan won by 54 votes out of 822 people voting.

I am disappointed and angry. I know not everyone in our denomination agrees on everything. I recently heard it said, "If you put two Methodists together, you get three opinions and a potluck dinner." That sounds about right. I know that there are likely people in our own faith community that disagree over human sexuality. I'm sure there are some who are simply uncertain. So be it. I want to be pastor of everyone.

People are not perfect. Churches are not perfect. The reason churches are not perfect is because it's filled with people. Our lack of perfection should not keep us from doing "the good." Far too often, people are judged because they are not perfect. According to Jesus, no one is good, except God because all goodness is a gift from God. (Mark 10:18). In other words, whatever goodness you and I may have is a gift from God and not of our own doing. Those of us who have given our lives over to Christ seek to be good the way Jesus is good. As Christians, we are people of the, "Good News," Gospel! What is the good news? God loves us. God wants to transform us into the wonderful people God created us to be.

God does not love us because we are perfect! God loves us despite our flaws. It is how we are to love one another. During the season of Lent we explore our flaws and seek healing and forgiveness. We also hope that we can be more like Jesus. When we consider the last couple of days of Jesus' life, we see betrayal, denial, injustice, pain, sorrow, mob rule, cruelty, dishonesty, torture, and death.

Jesus is both the perfect and good Son of God. He died because of imperfect people. Thank God! The story does not end there! There is resurrection! We are Easter people. We remain flawed but because of the grace of God, we have been given new life. We are to be changed by the presence of the Holy Spirit as we live as disciples of Jesus Christ. Let us strive for the goodness that is found in the resurrection of Jesus. Let us also strive to see one another the way God does. God, who is perfect, is certainly not the enemy of good. We do not need to be perfect to seek the good.




Tuesday Morning


